

Invacare recommends that you contact your travel carrier and/or tour guide about your travel plans and provide information about your intent to use a portable oxygen concentrator (POC) during your travels. The carrier will let you know if you will be permitted to use your XPO<sub>2</sub> during your travel and if there are any restrictions for use.
